## 1. Background

**Good practice:** IdA 'Integration through Exchange' programme in Germany (2007-2013 ESF funding period): approx. 16.000 programme participants, 290 host organisation, 26 countries

**Weaknesses** of transnational cooperation in the 2007-13 programming period:

- lack of institutionalised coordination
- project operators found it hard to identify TNC partners in other MS
- expenditure for preparation of transnational projects generally not eligible in MS

### **Idea for TLN Mobility:**

Starting from the EU regulations, MS and Regions (Managing Authorities) share a common framework for mobility and -within the context of an agreed timetable - launch calls national / regional programs aimed at professionals responsible for the management of operations.

### Strategic aims:

- Integrating disadvantaged young people and young adults in the world of work by improving their skills, knowledge and expertise through work-related learning experiences abroad
- Encourage transnational cooperation ESF through the creation of a reference model of coordinated action at national / regional level.

Organize transnational conference to share results and increase participation in call

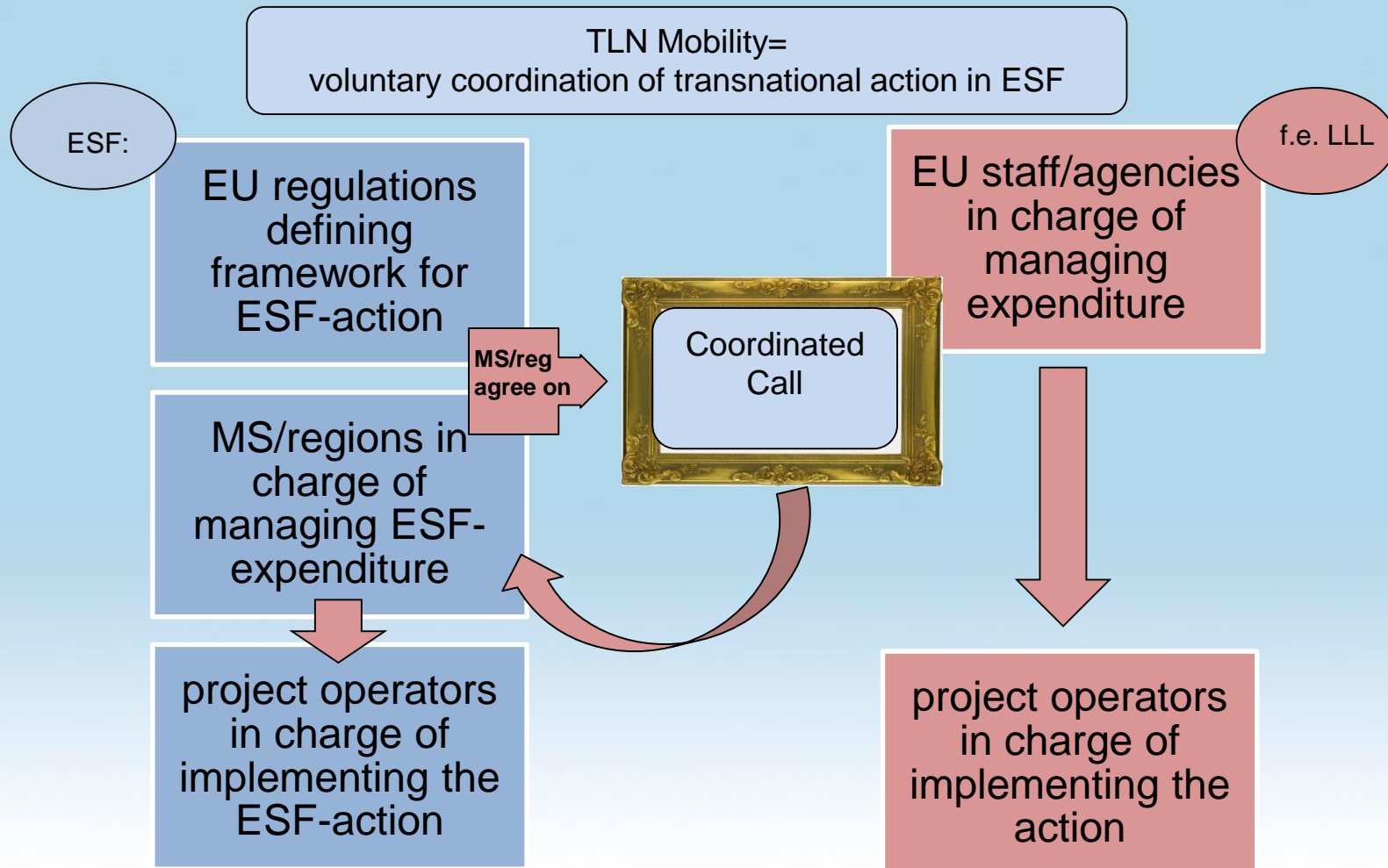


*Specific Objective 3: Support for launch of individual calls on national/regional level*

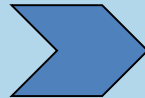
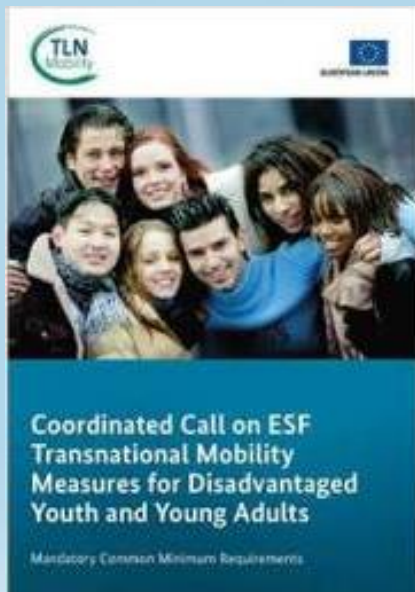
Define and implement specific support measures which MS/Regions (may) request

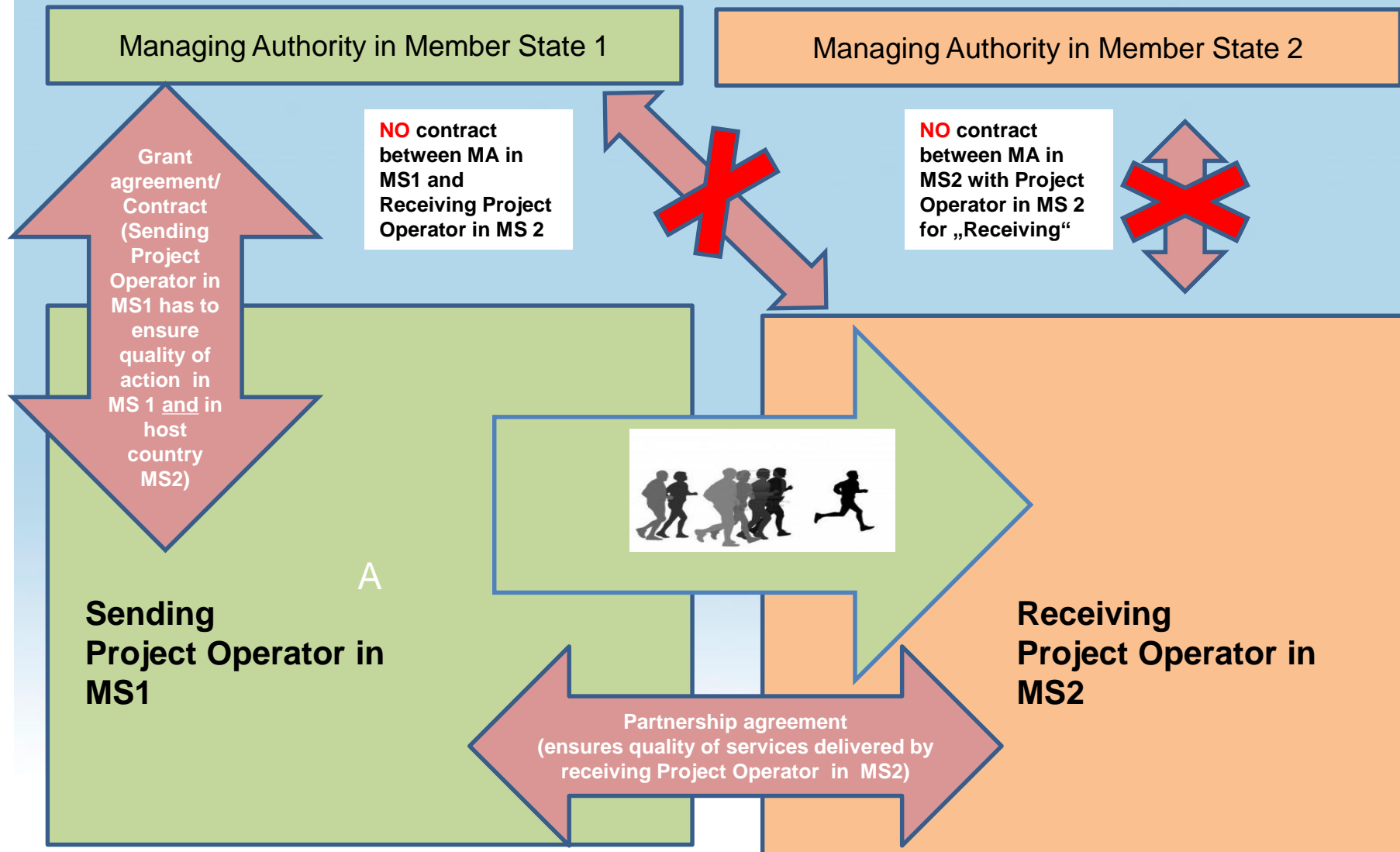

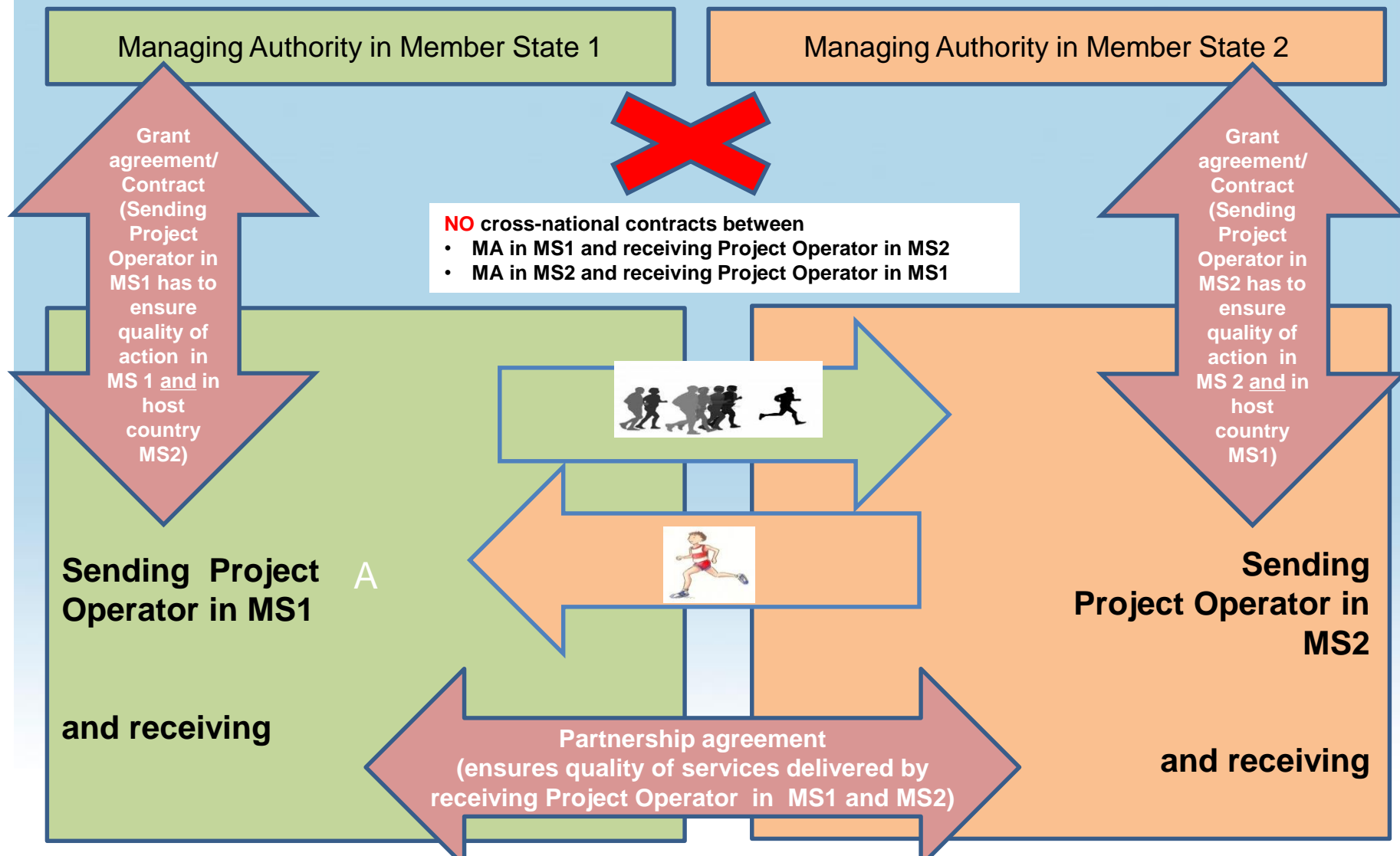

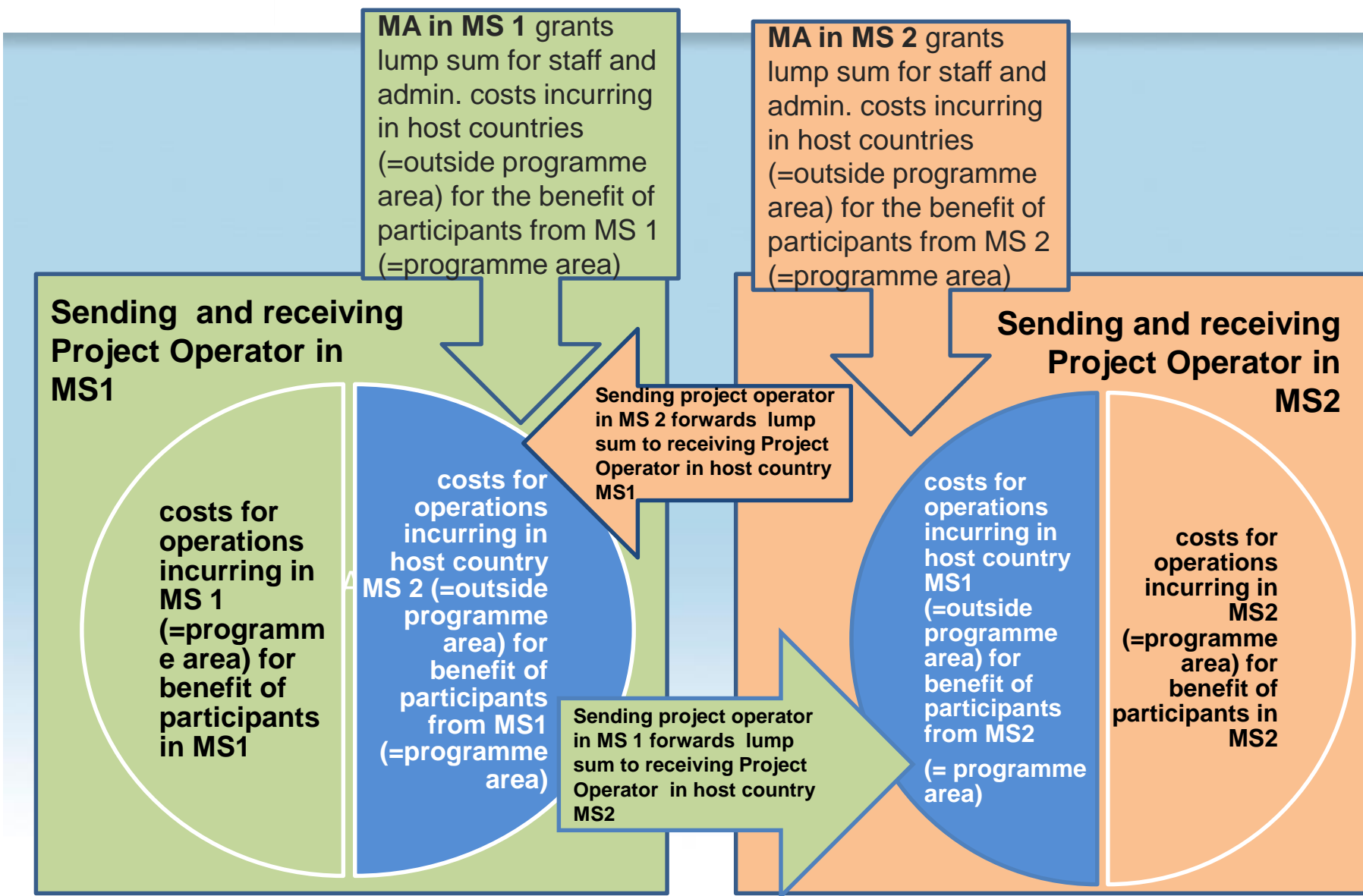

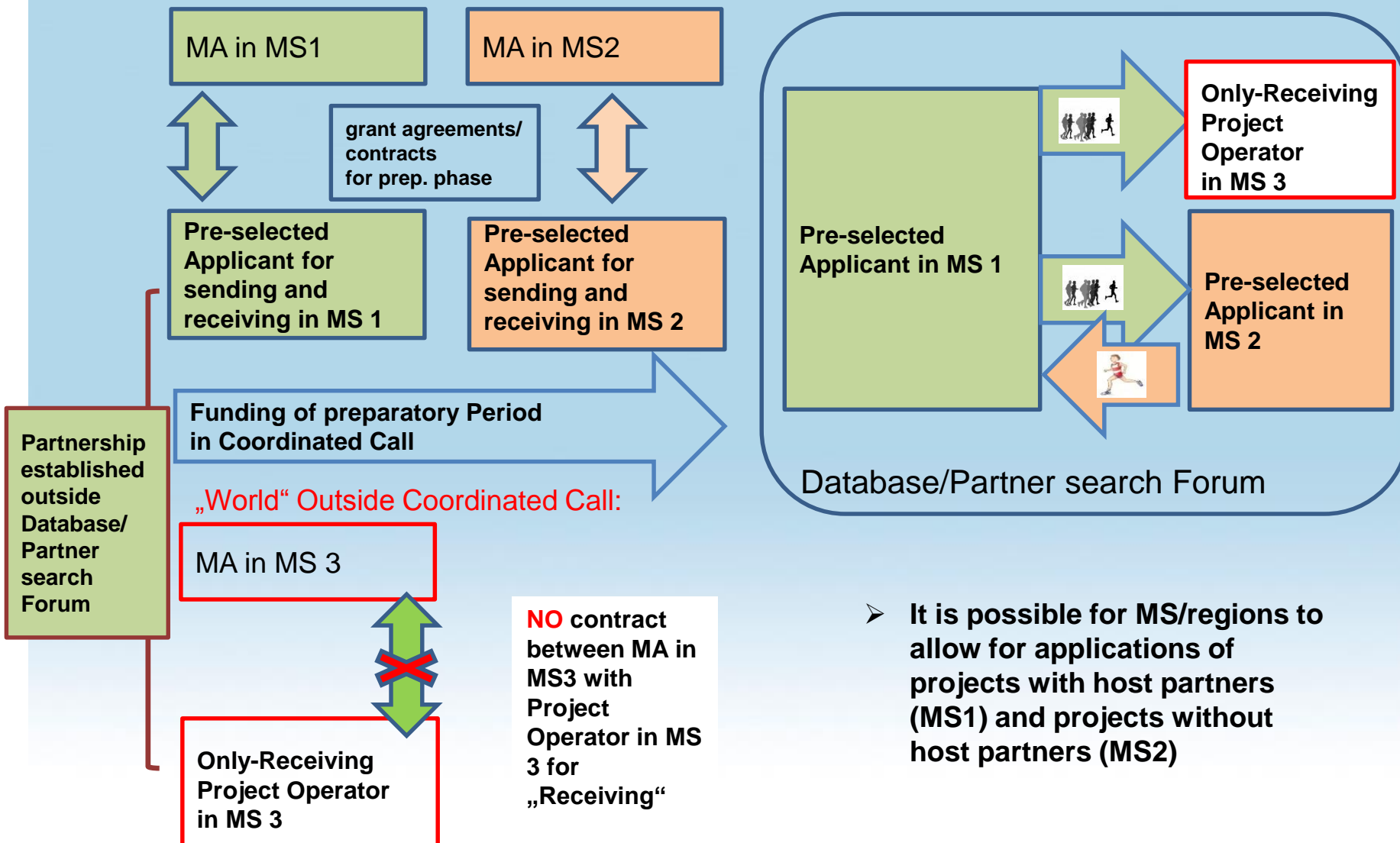
